THIS MORNING'S READINGS

COLLECT OF THE DAY

Almighty God, as your kingdom dawns, turn us from the darkness of sin to the light of holiness, that we may be ready to meet you in our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. **Amen**

OLD TESTAMENT READING - Isaiah 2.1 - 5

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!

NEW TESTAMENT READING - Romans 13.11 - end

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

THE HOLY GOSPEL - Matthew 24.36 - 44

'But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

O Lord our God, make us watchful and keep us faithful as we await the coming of your Son our Lord; that, when he shall appear, he may not find us sleeping in sin but active in his service and joyful in his praise; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

CAROL SINGING: We are carol singing in support of homeless people at the Co-Op on in Baildon on Saturday 14th and Saturday 21st December from 10.00am to raise funds for our December Charity. All welcome to join in!

PARISH CHRISTMAS CARD: As in previous years we hope to give congregations the opportunity to send their Christmas wishes to all the friends in Church by writing their wishes and then donating the money they would have spent on Christmas cards to charity. In previous years we have done this by the big Christmas card, this year we want to try and something different but we need your help. Have you got any spare artificial green Christmas trees that you could give to the Church (we need three in total – one for each Church). From the 8th December these will be out in the church and you are invited to send your Christmas wishes to the congregations by writing on a label and placing it on the tree. We hope that the tree will be covered with baubles and stars sharing Christmas wishes. You are then invited to make a donate the money you would have spent on cards to the homeless as our December charity.

CHARITY OF THE MONTH: December's Charity – homeless people: 'Shelter', 'Centrepoint' and 'Crisis'. Shelter helps people struggling with bad housing or homelessness – through Advice, Support and Legal Services; Centrepoint – the shocking truth is that this Christmas, 22,000 young people in England will face homelessness. Wherever they end up, they are all at risk of robbery, abuse, attack and exploitation. How can this be right? Crisis at Christmas – being homeless at Christmas can be a nightmare: sleeping on someone's floor, under a railway arch, in a shed. One in four will spend Christmas alone. Crisis runs Centres which give homeless people a Christmas dinner and friendship, and an opportunity to have a long hot shower and fresh warm clothes.

NEW CHAIRS: The new chairs have arrived! We have 15 new chairs at St John's for the space in front of the organ. Would anyone like to sponsor a chair? TRAIDCRAFT TRADE JUSTICE CAMPAIGN: Traidcraft is concerned that the British government wants to include a controversial court system called ISDS in trade deals after Brexit, giving away powers to big business to sue poor countries for millions for lost profits. For example, in Argentina the government froze water prices in a financial crisis to make sure it stayed affordable for the poorest communities. In response water companies including Anglian Water used the ISDS system to sue the government for 'lost profits'. Instead of ruling that people's human right to water should come ahead of company profits, the tribunal ordered Argentina to pay out £251 million. Traidcraft considers this system to be deeply unfair and undemocratic and to risk undermining efforts to tackle vital issues such as climate change, social injustice and poverty. DO YOU WANT TO HELP WITH THE FINANCIAL RUNNING OF THE PARISH?: As our Parish Treasurer, Richard Nicholas, is retiring in 2020 after dedicating many years to the role, we are looking to spread the load of this very important job. Here is a flavour of the work which needs to be done, which could be done by different people - could YOU help?

Weekly Sheets: Collect cash and cheques from St James' and St John's, itemise, pay into the bank (Barclays), and submit report. 1-2 hours per week.

Salaries: Organise the payment of some of the Parish salaries. 3-4 hours per month.

Gift Aid: Keying in the names and addresses for gift aid donations to claim Gift Aid for the Parish. 4 -5 hours per month.

Wedding & Funeral Invoices: Set process to be followed for invoicing of weddings and funerals, and following up for payment before the service takes place. Timing is ad hoc but needs action quickly on booking.

Bank Reconciliation, Managing the Books, Month End & Year End: This role needs someone with accountancy or book-keeping experience, and would need some coordination with those performing any of the other roles in this list. 8-10 hours per week, and more at month & year end.
