Church Seat Booking - The PCC has decided that from today seats for church services do not need to be booked in advance. This means you will just be able to come along to Sunday Service whenever you like. The guidance tells us that we can sit in groups of six from multiple households. Clearly our pews don't accommodate six but it does mean we can sit people together outside their households. We will continue to practice social distancing, using only alternative pews, wearing face masks, observing a one-way system around church and offering hand sanitiser. When you arrive you will be shown to a seat which complies with the guidance. We understand that some people may not feel ready to sit with others and please feel free to communicate this to the person who is showing you to your seat. We will be happy to offer you a place with more distance.

Mobile Devices in Church - You will no doubt be aware that we have had some technical difficulties with the newly installed live streaming

equipment in church. As we endeavour to iron out these problems, we ask that you don't use any mobile devices during services so that we can eliminate the chance of interference. Paper copies of the service booklet are always available.

Family Worship – Sunday 4th July at 10.00am – The 4th July is National Thank You Day and we are taking this as our theme for our Family Worship. This is a big day nationally and I hope that many people will want to come to church and give thanks to God for all the work that has been done by many people, both paid and voluntary, to help us through the pandemic. We would like to make this a joint parish service, inviting all congregations and the wider community to a time of great celebration. You may not have felt comfortable coming back to worship before now, and this is completely understandable, but please consider coming and joining us, it would be lovely to welcome you back. During the service we have invited several people who have taken specific roles during this past year and have asked them to say a little about how it felt for them to be involved. The children from the Junior Choir will be singing. Afterwards we are aiming to extend our hospitality and offer tea and coffee, hopefully if the weather is nice we can take this outside.

There will no need to book for this service but we will always keep everyone COVID safe. If you would rather not sit with anyone else, that's fine, just tell the person who seats you. We really hope that this service will be time of great celebration and of welcome. We look forward to seeing you there.

Craft through Worship - will be meeting at St Hugh's Church on Sunday 27th June at 6pm. You don't need to book and everyone is welcome. Refreshments will be served. Our theme for this year is Stewardship and Sustainability and in June we are thinking about 'Our Land?' Resources in the form of ideas for reflection and crafting on the theme will be sent out on Sunday 20th June. Refugees and asylum seekers are the focus for our parish fund-raising in June and July. It has been incredibly hard for these groups to live any sort of life during lockdown, especially those who have been confined to their limited accommodation and eking out their subsistence allowance, unable to put their qualifications to good use. Two local charities (**BIASAN** and **BEACON**) have been very active in supporting these vulnerable people: offering English lessons on-line, providing weekly food parcels, supplying

free clothes and household goods, paying for phone top-ups, and giving legal and emotional support.

To raise money for them, you are warmly invited to a **Refuge-Tea** at the home of Caroline & Michael Skelton, 2 Highfield Mews, BD17 5PF, on Saturday 10 July, from 10.00am to 12.00pm. There will be a raffle and a stall selling cakes and home produce : do bring something to sell with you!

Also, Michael is hoping to shed 10 pounds weight over the two months, by cutting out all the sugary things that he so enjoys : cakes, chocolate, biscuits, fruit juice, etc. He is asking for sponsorship at the rate of £1.00 for every pound weight lost. Please use the usual channels for making donations, with the reference REFUGEES. Thank you.
