FAMILY SERVICE - our next Family Service will be on Sunday 4th September. The theme is celebration, thinking about the woman who celebrated when she found a coin she had lost. There will be plenty of activities including making a celebration biscuit!

SIDESPEOPLE AT ST JOHN'S 10AM SERVICE - Now that we returned to worship every week, it would be great to welcome more people onto the rota as a Sidesperson. The role is not difficult, it just involves being in Church at about 9.30am, welcoming people into Church and handing out the service sheets.
