FOOD BANK – St Hugh's food bank has become very busy. As a consequence, our stocks are really low. Donations can be left in the boxes outside St John's and St James's churches and inside St Hugh's foyer (the door is always open on Wednesdays 9am to 3pm). We are particularly short of: UHT milk, cereals, toilet roll, tinned meat (eg ham, minced beef in gravy, chicken in sauce, hotdogs), coffee, sugar, bread (we will freeze the loaves to make sure we give them in time), cat and dog food.
