There is an opportunity over refreshments in the Church Hall to have a look at the kneelers we hold at St John's and see if there is one that you would like to take home. These will be available until Sunday 5th March and then the remainder will be donated to another church. If you would like to make a donation, any money given will be used to improve St John's Church historically ie re-gilding the lettering in the porch area.

THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER is a huge wave of prayer which circles the earth: beginning at dawn in Tonga, and ending at dusk in Samoa – 38 hours later! It is amazing to be part of something so huge, so important and so special. This year the Service has been prepared by the Christians of TAIWAN. You will be aware that China is harassing Taiwan, claiming the country as its sovereign territory. So the Taiwanese people need our constant prayers. It is always inspiring to hear about how Christians in other countries have overcome great challenges, and their reliance on God has strengthened their faith. Our Service is on FRIDAY, 3rd MARCH, at the Methodist Church, at 7pm – PLEASE COME! **WARM WEDNESDAYS** - St Hugh's is a Warm Space every Wednesday 9am to 2pm. We have toasted teacakes, crumpets and warm drinks from 9am and homemade soup and cakes for lunch from 12 noon. We have the daily newspapers and our little library available. Warm Spaces are designed to offer companionship, food and drink, and heated seated areas in these times of difficulty. Everybody is welcome and food and refreshments is offered free or on a Pay-As-You-Feel basis. We offer this in association with Bradford Council who have provided a grant for this service.
