We have seen how Jesus asks us to represent God's love, practically, by showing kindness and welcome to people around us – as represented in our chains. I now invite you to join your chains together with the chains of those around you until all the pieces are linked into one long chain.

We now stand so that the chain is held by everyone present. This chain represents many (potential) acts of kindness; it is so long only because everyone has contributed to it. That is how we should represent Jesus in our community! Let's pray together

Loving God, as we hold this chain of acts of kindness between us, send us all out to show people what you are like.
Be with us as we share your love and kindness each day this week.

All Amen.

I encourage you to keep your chain links in your bag or in a suitable place at home – on the fridge, perhaps – as a reminder to look for opportunities to show kindness to others this coming week.

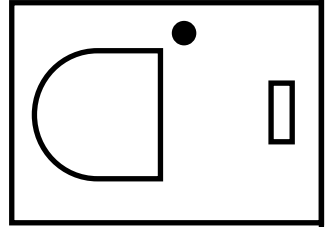
FOOD BANK - You may remember St Hugh's Food Bank was experiencing some issues. We have been working with Bradford Council, the Youth Service and the Police to resolve these issues. We have also redeveloped the whole food bank system to make it more manageable, reliable and secure. As a result we have presently solved the problem of theft at St John's and the donation box has been reinstalled. Baildon Co-op have provided a collection point by the tills and you don't have to buy from the Co-op to leave donations in that basket. We are very short of supplies and any donations you can make would be greatly appreciated. UHT milk, tins of meat, fish, vegetables, fruit and packets of cereal, teabags and biscuits are useful. Collection points are located at St John's, St James, St Hugh's (inside the entrance) and Baildon Co-op.
