# **Giving of Communion**

Before the Distribution the president says

God's holy gifts for God's holy people

This part of the service is when we come together as family to receive God's gifts and to remember his love for us. Please come to the altar rail at the direction of the churchwarden.

At the distribution of the bread and wine these words will be said

The body of Christ keep you in eternal life The blood of Christ keep you in eternal life

The communicant replies Amen.

You are invited to join in with singing
