SCARECROW FESTIVAL - 30th SEPTEMBER - you will know by now that Baildon is once again running a Scarecrow Festival and the St John's is very much a part of it with exhibits both in the Church and the grounds. The Parish stall will also be open for people and we would like to be able to offer refreshments but we need your help in the following ways:-

- we need cakes or scones.
- We need volunteers to cover the 11am 4pm opening of the Festival, at least two people for every hour.

There are sign up sheets at the back of church this morning in each church, sign up for the times you can offer and also if you able to bring a cake or scones.

We hope that the Festival will be a great success with many people involved and the offer of refreshments shows our hospitality to all come.

HARVEST APPEAL - This year's Harvest Appeal (which will last the whole of October, finishing at the Joint Service on the 29th October) will be for Action Aid, specifically their work in Morocco. ActionAid is an international charity that works with women and girls living in poverty and has been present in Morocco for more than 20 years, working in collaboration with local partner organisations. Their local partner

organisations are working to assess the earthquake's impact and the best way to respond, including conducting a needs assessment in Al Houz region, just south of Marrakech. In the immediate aftermath of this disaster, the priority will be to provide emergency support in the way of shelter, clothing and food to those who have lost their homes and are out on the streets. ActionAid is calling for our support to the affected regions.

There will be an opportunity to give a donation during the Harvest Festival services across the parish—St John's and St Hugh's on 1st October and St James's on the 8th. Details of other ways to donate will be provided next week.

HARVEST BRING AND SHARE AT ST JOHN'S - We are aiming to put on a Bring and Share Lunch after the Harvest Festival at St John's on 1st October, but we obviously need food! There is a list at the back of church for you to sign up indicating the food you will be bringing. If you want to bring something not on the list, great, just add it!

ANDREW CRAWFORD - We have all been shocked and deeply saddened to hear of the death of Andrew Crawford who, before Covid, played the organ regularly at St James's Church as well as across the parish. Since Covid he had enjoyed being one of the organists at Halifax Minister. There is a Memorial Service for Andrew which been arranged for Sunday 8th October at 4pm again at Halifax Minister.

WEDNESDAY MIDDAY COMMUNION - The next midday communion at St James' will be on Wednesday 4th October.
