HARVEST APPEAL— This year's Harvest Appeal (which will last the whole of October, finishing at the Joint Service on the 29th October) will be for Action Aid, specifically their work in Morocco. ActionAid is an international charity that works with women and girls living in poverty and has been present in Morocco for more than 20 years, working in collaboration with local partner organisations. Their local partner organisations are working to assess the earthquake's impact and the best way to respond, including conducting a needs assessment in Al Houz region, just south of Marrakech. In the immediate aftermath of this disaster, the priority will be to provide emergency support in the way of shelter, clothing and food to those who have lost their homes and are out on the streets. ActionAid is calling for our support to the affected regions. If you would like to give via BACS please use 'Harvest' as your reference.
