# **NOTICES**

**REFRESHMENTS** - Everyone is very welcome to join us for refreshments in the church hall after this service.

**SUNDAY SCHOOL** - At St John's we need people to help in our Sunday School. If you feel able to lead a session (only once a month) or be a helper please speak to Canon Sandra. Teaching our children is vital work so please do consider if you can help in this work. Resources are available each week so you don't have to think up ideas!

HARVEST APPEAL - This year's Harvest Appeal across the whole of October, finishing at the Joint Service on the 29th October, will be for the international charity ActionAid; specifically their work in Morocco with women and girls living in poverty The charity has been present in Morocco for more than 20 years, working in collaboration with local partner organisations. These local partners are working to assess the

earthquake's impact and the best way to respond, including conducting a needs assessment in Al Houz region, just south of Marrakech. In the immediate aftermath of this disaster, the priority will be to provide emergency support in the way of shelter, clothing and food to those who have lost their homes and are out on the streets. ActionAid is calling for our support to the affected regions. If you would like to give via BACS please use 'Harvest' as your reference. Text **BAILDONHARVEST** followed by your donation amount to **70085** to give that amount. Texts will cost the donation amount plus one standard network rate message.

**ALL SOULS SERVICE -** We will holding our annual All Souls Service this year on Sunday 29th October at 4.30pm at St John's Church. At the back of church there is a sheet to add the names of loved ones (in Capital Letters) you wish to be remembered at that service. Do come and use this service to remember them. If transport is a problem, please speak to a member of the clergy.

**PRAYER TREES** - From 10th October you will find a prayer tree in the grounds of each of our churches in the parish as we prepare for All Souls-tide and Remembrance. Anyone is welcome to attach to the tree words or a ribbon in memory of a loved one, or lay flowers around the base of the tree. Resources are provided in the box if you need them.

**REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY –** On 12th November there will be a Civic Service at St John's Church at 1.00pm, followed by a parade down to the War Memorial for 2.30pm where there will be remembrance and wreath laying for any who wish to take part. **DEANERY SYNOD** - The next Synod meeting is on Monday 16th October at 7.30pm at St Michael's, Cottingley. Admiral Nurses, specialists in this field, will be helping us to think about issues around Dementia and Alzheimer's.
