Where we have made many rules and neglected the one common liberating law of love (hands cupped together in front)

All You call us to forgiveness

Open our eyes to see you again

- All Risen and Real Open our ears to your words of grace
- All Releasing and Restoring Open our lives to follow you afresh
- All Repentant and Ready.
