The Offering of Symbolic Gifts

The offering of the soil

R We bring the soil of our fields, symbol of all that God has created.

The earth is the Lord's

All And all that is in it.

The offering of the fruits of the earth

R We bring the harvest of our fields and of our gardens, symbols of our work in partnership with God.

Yet we know we shall not live by bread alone,

All but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.

The offering of seeds

R We bring the seeds for next year's planting, symbol of God's promise to provide our daily bread.

They sow fields and plant vineyards which give them fruitful harvest.

All He blesses them and they multiply greatly.

The offering of water

R We bring water, symbol of our dependence on God for life, symbol of the new life he gives in baptism.

God will sprinkle clear water over you.

All We shall be cleansed from all that defiles us.

The offering of bread and wine

R We bring bread and wine, symbol of our use of God's gifts, symbol of his spiritual food, the sacrament of his body and blood.

Everything in heaven and earth is yours,

All All things come from you, and of your own do we give you.

Heavenly Father, with our thanksgiving, we ask pardon for our failure always to be good stewards of your gifts. Accept this loaf of bread and this wine as a sign of our gratitude, and of our desire to dedicate our work and our lives to your praise and glory.

The Blessing and Dismissal


Once more we have celebrated the harvest, brought our gifts, said our prayers and remembered our God.

REFRESHMENTS - everyone is very welcome to join us for our bring and share and lunch.

ALL SOULS SERVICE - our annual All Souls Service this year will be held at St John's Church on Sunday 27th October at 4.30pm. In the next few weeks a list of names to be remembered during this service will be at the back of each church. If you wish loved ones to be remembered it would be lovely to see you at the service.

GIVING - at our joint service last week we looked at our giving across the parish and our giving currently doesn't meet our expenditure - we are £57,000 in deficit. With this service sheet there is a sheet to show this in more detail. Clearly this is not sustainable and we really need help in making our budget balance. As Christians the Church of England suggests that we consider giving a monthly donation of 5% of our net income. Obviously the amount you give is up to you and this is a guide. If you are able to make a monthly gift it would be great if you were able to do this using the Parish Giving Scheme (leaflets are available at the back of church). FAMILY SERVICE IN NOVEMBER - our next Family Service will be Sunday 3rd November at 10am at St John's Church. This will be a Family Communion Service.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY - is Sunday 10th November. This year at St John's will be holding a service at **10.30am** which will be our Civic Act of Remembrance. During this service we will join with the country in pausing at 11am to remember those who have given their lives, or who have been injured, in wars past and present. Everyone is very welcome to join us for this service.

MESSY CHURCH - our next Messy Church session is Sunday 20th October. We meet at 4pm in St John's Church Hall, all families welcome.

PRAYER MEMORIAL TREES – are offered again this year outside each Church, for everyone to use to remember loved ones.
