A special thank you to those who donate money regularly. We were able to do a big shop on Monday which has made the shelves look healthier.

For those wondering what pushes our claimants into food poverty, here are the most common answers we hear: Ill health, unemployment, benefits/wages not covering living expenses, a sudden rise in household bills, unexpected bills and mental health issues.
