Through the link we support and encourage our brothers and sisters who feel marginalised and oppressed in their own country, yet maintain their faith in Christ with great courage. Civil war broke out in Sudan in April 2023 and there is currently no end in sight. 14 million people are displaced from their homes and 150,000 people have been killed. This is the great overlooked humanitarian crisis of our time in which 24.6 million people face acute hunger, more than 30 million people need humanitarian assistance.
