St Hugh's Food Bank provides weekly bags of food to local children, identified by primary schools as needing some extra help. This year we fed 54 children from 23 families for the whole 6 week holiday. This is a mammoth effort, from shopping, packing, distribution, planning, co-ordination and funding. We needed the help of 8 volunteers and 3 workers to run the scheme.
