We stand and at Midnight Communion we light the Christ-light in our Advent Candle and switch on the Christmas Tree lights.

We light the Christ candle as a sign to the world that today, in the City of David, a Saviour is born, who is Christ the Lord. We no longer have to fear the darkness for our Light has come. That light that enlightens all people has broken into our world. And the world will never be the same again.

Preparation of the Table

The gifts of the people are gathered and presented. The table is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it. The following prayer is said. Please remain standing for the whole of the Eucharistic Prayer.

Giving of Communion

The president gives the invitation to communion

Christ is the true bread which has come down from heaven.

All Lord, give us this bread always.

The president and people receive communion. Everyone is very welcome to receive the bread and wine whether you've been baptised or confirmed. Please come forward at the direction of the Church Wardens. For reason of hygiene the Church of England does not allow intinction (dipping bread into the wine). If you don't feel able to take the wine from the common cup today please just receive the bread, which will be the full presence of Christ for you. At the distribution of the bread and wine these words will be said
