NATIONAL EMERGENCY BRIEFING In November, some of the UK's leading experts briefed an audience of over 1,200 politicians and leaders from business, culture, faith, sport and the media. A 45-minute film presented by the naturalist Chris Packham is now bringing the message into communities across the UK. Screenings are taking place all around the country bringing constituents, civic leaders and MPs together to hear the evidence - and consider what an emergency response should look like. CONFIRMATION SERVICE On Sunday 19th July at 3.00pm St John's will be hosting the Deanery Confirmation Service led by Bishop Toby, Acting Bishop of Leeds. We have three adults and several young people from this parish as well as those from the Deanery. This is a very important service and it would be great to have the whole parish come and support our candidates. We have decided to make this afternoon service the only service in the Parish for that day, so please do make a note in your diaries for the 19th.

'IF MY PEOPLE PRAY ...' From Tuesday 7th July 12 noon in the Cranmer Room we will gather weekly for a time for prayer. Everyone is very welcome to join us for about 20 minutes to ask God for a fresh outpouring of his Holy Spirit upon us as we seek to share the good news of God's love with those around us.

SUNG CHORAL EVENSONG A service of Choral Evensong will be held at St James' Church on Sunday 26 July at 4pm to celebrate St James's Patronal Festival, followed by Afternoon Tea. The service lasts about 45 minutes and is led by the choir, who will sing Preces and Responses by Sanders, the Psalm appointed for the day, the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis in Bb by Stanford and an Anthem, "Evening Hymn" by Gardiner. If you are unused to Choral Evensong, it is a very peaceful, reflective service where the choir do the majority of the singing and the congregation joins in the hymns and the said parts of the service. There are bible readings, prayers and a homily (sermon). As the Parish of Baildon doesn't currently hold a regular service of Evensong, we were therefore eligible for a grant from the Choral Evensong Trust specifically for a Patronal Festival Evensong which is to be used towards the costs of any music and refreshments. We have also received a financial contribution from our Patron, Philip Baxter. To enable us to make adequate provision for food and drink, please could you use the sign up sheet to indicate that you'll be attending and note any dietary requirements/food allergies.
